

# DEVELOPING A FAMILY CHARTER

## A Template for Farm Transition Planning

The purpose of this family charter document is to clearly define individual roles, responsibilities and operating rules in writing transition and succession plans for the land and farming business. It establishes procedures for how the family communicates and makes decisions on the transition process. It lays out a blueprint for conducting the steps in the business transition and defines how the family works in an empowered manner, including setting out responsibility and authority. Finally, it complements our family coaching piece by facilitating stakeholder buy in: involving family members in the decision making process and obtaining their concurrence along the way.

Together, your family is asked to discuss and complete the following sections of this charter:

### **1. Purpose:**
